Teaching Areas: Direct practice, introduction to social work, practice with individuals and families, social work in international contexts, interprofessional practice, field education

Course Development:

- Field Preparation and Professional Development- Developed this course to better prepare field students for their internship semester and to streamline the placement process for field. This course was developed in response to student and community agency feedback about lack of readiness and professionalism. This course was developed as a 1 credit hour course and was designed as an online course to allow for participation by on campus as well as distance students. Student readiness is assessed each semester and informal feedback from field agencies is collected and has been positive.
- Online Teaching Excellence Institute (OTEI)- Selected for OTEI to develop online course for SW4690 utilizing best practice strategies for effective online teaching. This online 4690 course will provide opportunities for expansion of the service area, greater flexibility for students in internships, and allows for greater assessment of student competency attainment. This course development was evaluated under strict guidelines to assure compliance with best practices identified by the Center for Academic Excellence. Participated in OTEI Fall 2020, initial class implementation Spring 2021.
- Trauma-Informed Practice- Co-development of a new interprofessional course to train undergraduate and graduate students from social work, nursing and public health. Course content includes knowledge about neurobiological impact of trauma, intervention strategies for clients who have experienced trauma, and the concept and implementation of trauma informed care in practice. Initial class taught Fall 2019.

Study Away and Study Abroad Courses:

 Co-developed and co-led interprofessional study away program to New York City. (2017 & 2019). This program involved students in social work and nursing programs within the Beaver College of Health Sciences. This program partnered with NYCares service organization to provide interprofessional and intercultural opportunities for learning. This program also involved cultural immersion opportunities within the diverse neighborhoods and peoples within the boroughs of

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- New York City. This program was co-led by nursing and social work faculty to provide ample opportunity for interprofessional interaction.
- Co-developed and co-led Uganda in Context courses for undergraduate students in social work and public health as well as graduate students in social work within the Beaver College of Health Sciences. This program involved two 3-credit courses, one prior to travel as well as one in-country learning experiences. This program partnered with Youth Focus Africa Foundation (YOFAFO) which is an NGO in Uganda focused on women and children. This program allowed for cultural immersion, interprofessional practice, cross-cultural exploration, and the exploration of social, economic and environmental justice issues within Uganda with specific focus on needs in the small village of Kitoola.
